


The Book that Brings Joy A few possible next steps

As you follow Jesus from this service of worship to the world that he loves, here are a few possible next steps in the light of the Scripture and sermon from Sunday, January 7.

Read

The bible is a library; sixty-six books that tell a single story in six chapters. Those chapters and that story all lead us to Jesus, the one who brings joy. This Sunday, we explored the first chapter in the biblical story, which is CREATION. Below is a list of readings to help you explore this chapter and theme during the week:

Practice

Take a hike, walk, run or drive with no other purpose but to see and enjoy the glory of God in the things he has made; mountains, rivers, trees, birds, dogs, and people. Yes, PEOPLE. Look at them too. Enjoy them too. But be careful not to stare. That would be creepy

Pray

Choose daily to rejoice with and for the creation of God by joining with the ancient praise of God's people in the words of Psalm 148:

Praise the LORD.

Praise the LORD from the heavens; praise him in the heights above.

Praise him, all his angels;

praise him, all his heavenly hosts.

Praise him, sun and moon;

praise him, all you shining stars.

Praise him, you highest heavens and you waters above the skies.

Let them praise the name of the LORD.

for at his command they were created,

and he established them for ever and ever -

he issued a decree that will never pass away.

Praise the LORD from the earth,

you great sea creatures and all ocean depths,

lightning and hail, snow and clouds,

stormy winds that do his bidding,

you mountains and all hills,

The Book that Brings Joy A few possible next steps (cont'd)

Reflect

According to Genesis 1:28, the image of God is a calling from God; a calling to "be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it." As you reflect on this calling, take a few minutes to reflect on these questions in connection with the daily readings:

Sunday: According to Genesis 1:31, "God saw everything he had made, and indeed, it was very good." Where have you seen the goodness of God in other people in the last week?

Monday: According to Genesis 2:15, human beings "subdue" the earth by "tilling and keeping it." In other words, by cultivating, not exploiting, it. Where is God calling you to be his image by nurturing others, cultivating community or caring for creation?

Tuesday: According to Psalm 8:6, God placed all things under our (humanity's) feet. In other words, we are responsible for all things, to care for, protect, and nurture the people and world in which we live. What people has God placed in your care? What relationships has God entrusted to you? What responsibilities does God want you to manage for others' good?

Wednesday: According to Psalm 139:14, we are "fearfully and wonderfully made." Take a few minutes to thank God for making you. What qualities, attributes, gifts, and/or skills move you to say (or shout!), "I am wonderfully made!"

Thursday: According to Proverbs 8:22-31, God created all things with and through wisdom. Where in creation do you see and feel closest to the wisdom and beauty and goodness of God?

Friday: According to John 1:14, "the word was made flesh and dwelled among us, and we've seen his glory." How does the glory of God's only son stand in stark contrast to the worldly glories of power, wealth, status, and fame?

Saturday: According to Colossians 1:15, Jesus is "the image of the invisible God." In him we see both the true God and true humanity. He is what it means to be fully and truly human. How would your neighborhood be different if everyone in it lived and loved more like Jesus and less like us?


- Donate food items from the list below. Place the items in the bin located at the Main Entrance.


