


The Book that Brings Joy A few possible next steps

As you follow Jesus from this service of worship to the world that he loves, here are a few possible next steps in the light of the Scripture and sermon from Sunday, January 21.

READ, REFLECT, PRACTICE, AND PRAY

Sunday: Acknowledging the Need for Renewal

- Scripture: Lamentations 3:22-23 "Because of the Lord's great love, we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."
- Pray: Begin the day by acknowledging areas in your life where you need God's renewal and lift them to God in prayer.
- Reflection: Consider moments in your life where you've experienced God's faithfulness in bringing about new beginnings.

Monday: Repentance and Forgiveness

- Scripture: Psalm 51:10 "Create in me a pure heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me."
- Pray: Spend time in a prayer of repentance and seek God's forgiveness for any shortcomings.
- Reflection: Reflect on the transformative power of God's forgiveness in your life.

Tuesday: Embracing God's Promises

- Scripture: Isaiah 43:18-19 "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing!"
- Practice: Write down specific promises from God's Word that speak to new beginnings.
- Pray: Claim the promises you need and lift them to God in the form of a prayer.
- Reflection: Contemplate how God's promises provide hope for the future.

Wednesday: Surrendering Control

- Scripture: Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight."
- Pray: Identify areas where you need to surrender control to God and lift them in prayer.
- Reflection: Meditate on the peace that comes from trusting God's plan.

Thursday: Prayer for Transformation

- Scripture: Romans 12:2 "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind."
- Pray: Spend extended time in prayer, asking God for personal transformation into the image and likeness of Jesus.
- Reflection: Consider how God's transformative work can impact your thoughts and actions. What will that look like today?



The Book that Brings Joy A few possible next steps (cont'd)

Friday: Gratitude for Second Chances

- Scripture: Lamentations 3:23 "They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."
- Pray: Create a list of things you are grateful for in terms of new beginnings and lift them to God in prayer.
- Reflection: Express gratitude for the second chances God has given you.

Saturday: Celebrating New Beginnings

- Scripture: 2 Corinthians 5:17 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"
- Pray: Praise God for His continuous work in making all things new.
- Reflection: Find ways to celebrate and share with others the new beginnings you've experienced.

May this week bring a deep sense of God's renewal and fresh beginnings in your life!

PRACTICE

Practice the Examen, a daily "examination of consciousness" first popularized by Ignatius of Loyola (1491-1556). According to Pete Greig, the examen can take five minutes or one hour and unfolds in four simple steps:

- 1. **Replay** Think over your day like a movie replaying in your head. Notice what you are noticing. What made you happy? What made you anxious? What made you angry?
- 2. **Rejoice** Thank God for those things which are obvious. But also thank Him for non-obvious things which we sometimes forget random acts of kindness, being healthy, a positive song or meal. Relish and savor these moments in gratitude to God.
- 3. **Repent** Say sorry to God for moments that come into your mind as you review the day e.g., getting involved in gossip, reacting with a tone that was aggressive, lacking compassion in a situation, ignoring a need, not responding to a nudge. Receive His forgiveness afresh.
- 4. **Reboot** Make a decision in your heart to live for Jesus tomorrow and ask for grace to see His presence more clearly.


On Saturday, January 27 from 10am-12pm as Cannon comes together to support the



Cannon Youth are heading to Orlando for an awesome two days at Walt Disney World. We will leave on Friday February 16, and return Monday, February 19.




