


UN(EXPECTED) A few possible next steps

We're getting ready for Easter by walking with Jesus through the Gospel of Matthew. We would love to share that journey with you as we spend time each week reading, reflecting, practicing, and praying.

Read

We are walking with Jesus through the Gospel of Matthew by reading the Gospel during Lent, the six-week long season that leads us to Easter. Below are the readings for this week!

Monday: Matthew 4:1-11

• Tuesday: Matthew 4:12-25

Wednesday: Matthew 5:1-16

Thursday: Matthew 5:17-48

• Friday: Matthew 6:1-8, 16-18

Saturday: Matthew 6:9-15

• Sunday: Catch up on your reading!

Reflect

Following each day's reading, take a few minutes to reflect on these questions:

- What does this passage reveal about Jesus? More specifically, what does it show us or tell us about who he is, what he said, what he did, and why it matters?
- How do people respond to Jesus in this passage? Are they faithful, curious, suspicious, or hostile? If the passage includes a teaching from Jesus, how does that teaching help us love God, other people, and ourselves?
- What word or phrase is most striking to you? Does it encourage or challenge you?
- How might the Spirit be inviting you to respond to this passage? Is there something here you might want to share with someone?

Practice

If you don't do so already, use the season of Lent as a great opportunity to develop the habit of beginning your day with God through prayer. Pick a place and a time and then put it in your calendar. If helpful, use the following suggestions from Pete Greig to help you get started.

How to have a 10 minute quiet time (using P.R.A.Y.)

- (1 min.) Pause Sit quietly for a minute, stilling your soul.
- (2 min.) **Rejoice** read a short Psalm or listen to a worship song.
- (3 min.) **Ask** Tell God what's on your heart. Pray through your day. If you have a prayer list or use the 24-7 Prayer Inner Room app, quietly name each person before God.
- (3 min.) **Yield** Read a few verses from the New Testament, until a phrase pops out at you and then talk to God about it. Are there any sins you need to confess? Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you afresh.
- (1 min.) **Amen** Pray the Lord's Prayer. Source: https://prayercourse.org/toolshed/

Pray

Each morning, before you engage with other people, pray this prayer from Mother Teresa of Calcutta:

Dear Jesus, help me to spread Your fragrance everywhere I go. Flood my soul with Your spirit and love. Penetrate and possess my whole being so utterly that all my life may only be a radiance of Yours. Shine through me and be so in me that every soul I come in contact with may feel Your presence in my soul. Let them look up and see no longer me but only Jesus. Stay with me and then I shall begin to shine as you shine, so to shine as to be a light to others. Amen.
