A few possible next steps

As we celebrate the good news that *Jesus was raised*, let us also *rise* into newness of life by pausing each day to read, reflect, practice, and pray.

Read

During this, the first week of Easter, we invite you to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus through these daily readings. Christ has risen! He has risen indeed!

- Sunday: Matthew 28:1-10, 16-20
- Monday: Mark 16:1-8
- Tuesday: Luke 24:1-12
- Wednesday: Luke 24:13-36
- Thursday: Luke 24:36-53
- Friday: John 20:1-18
- Saturday: John 20:19-31

Reflect

When you need to pause for a moment of peace, read and reflect on any or all of the following celebrations of the resurrection of Jesus.

Paint Christ not dead but risen, with His foot set in scorn on the split rock with which they sought to hold Him down! Paint Him the Conqueror of death! Paint Him the Lord of Life! Paint Him as what He is, the irresistible Victor who, tested to the uttermost, has proved Himself in very deed mighty to save! Tommaso Campanella (1568-1639)

"He is risen!" was the victorious cry of the early Christians, and they spread it to the ends of the earth.

Practice

If you don't do so already, use the first week of Easter as a great opportunity to develop the habit of beginning your day with God through prayer. Pick a place and a time and then put it in your calendar. If helpful, use the following suggestions from Pete Greig to help you get started.

How to have a 10 minute quiet time (using P.R.A.Y.)

- (1 min.) **Pause** Sit quietly for a minute, stilling your soul.
- (2 min.) **Rejoice** read a short Psalm or listen to a worship song.
- (3 min.) **Ask** Tell God what's on your heart. Pray through your day. If you have a prayer list or use the 24-7 Prayer Inner Room app, quietly name each person before God.
- (3 min.) **Yield** Read a few verses from the New Testament, until a phrase pops out at you and then talk to God about it. Are there any sins you need to confess? Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you afresh.
- (1 min.) **Amen** Pray the Lord's Prayer. Source: https://prayercourse.org/toolshed/

Pray

As you journey through the first week of Easter, briefly pause each morning to offer this prayer at the start of your day:

Almighty God, who through your only begotten Son Jesus Christ overcame death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life. Grant that we, who celebrate with joy the day of the Lord's resurrection, may be raised from the death of sin by your life-giving Spirit; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.






