

A few possible next steps

As we seek to be ROOTED, as Jesus was, in GOD through PRAYER, we invite you to join us each day this week as we Read, Reflect, Practice, and Pray.

Read

Since the early church was deeply connected with Jesus through prayer, we will spend the next two months reading the book of Acts. Most often referred to as The Acts of the Apostles, it is more accurately called The Acts of the Risen Lord by His Spirit through His Church. Read on and see why!

Practice

For most of Christian history, believers have paused three times a day to pray the Lord's Prayer. During the months of April and May, we're encouraging everyone to adopt this ancient practice at whatever times work best for you. The key is to make it a habit. Set your alarm as a gentle reminder to pause and pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

Reflect

When you need to be inspired to dwell deeply with Jesus and others through prayer, read and reflect on any or all of the following observations about the Lord's Prayer:

What praying to the Father can be more truthful than that which was delivered to us by the Son who is the Truth, out of his mouth?

Cyprian of Carthage (d. 258)

Let us not imagine that what we have learned is just some words that we are to repeat at certain times set aside for prayer ... Our entire life is to be a constant prayer that says, "Our Father, who art in heaven."

Origen of Alexandria (d. 254)

When Jesus gave his disciples this prayer, he was giving them part of his own breath, his own life, his own prayer. N. T. Wright (b. 1948)

In addition to praying the Lord's Prayer three times per day, we're inviting everyone to experiment with one-sentence prayers; simple, brief prayers drawn from Scripture that help us re-center our hearts on God. This week, consider using, "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1) as your one-sentence prayer. Repeat it (briefly!) through the day for others and yourself. Imagine coming to Jesus with that one request: "Lord, teach us to pray!"









Online Giving Instructions


