

All Saints' Sunday A few possible next steps

As we celebrate the hope that never dies, we invite you to pause briefly each day to read, reflect, practice, and pray.

READ

What does the New Testament reveal about the hope of the gospel, the promise that death itself will die?

Monday: Romans 8:18-21 Tuesday: 1 Corinthians 15

Wednesday: Philippians 3:17-4:1 Thursday: 1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:11

Friday: Revelation 21 Saturday: Revelation 22

Sunday: Catch up on your reading!

REFLECT

As you read the passages above, take a moment to reflect on any or all of the following observations from C. S. Lewis's "The Weight of Glory", a sermon he preached at Oxford in 1942.

- To please God...to be loved by God, not merely pitied, but delighted in as an artist delights in his work or a father in a son it seems impossible, a weight or burden of glory which our thoughts can hardly sustain. But so it is.
- There are no ordinary people. You have never talked to a mere mortal.
 Nations, cultures, arts, civilizations these are mortal, and their life is to ours as the life of a gnat. But it is immortals whom we joke with, work with, marry, snub, and exploit immortal horrors or everlasting splendors.
- Apparently, then, our lifelong nostalgia, our longing to be reunited with something in the universe from which we now feel cut off, to be on the inside of some door which we have always seen from the outside, is no mere neurotic fancy, but the truest index of our real situation. And to be at last summoned inside would be both glory and honor beyond all our merits and also the healing of that old ache.

PRACTICE

Take a few minutes to grieve this week. Name those you have lost, from whom you are separated, for now, by death. Be honest with God and yourself about your sadness. Give thanks to God for the gladness they brought, and still bring, to your heart. Ask God to care for them as you no longer can. Pray for the patience to wait in hope for your reunion with them in the presence of God.

PRAY

As you spend the week remembering the saints, pause daily to offer this prayer to God from *The Book of Common Prayer*:

O Almighty God, who hast knit together thine elect in one communion and fellowship, in the mystical body of thy Son Christ our Lord: Grant us grace so to follow thy blessed Saints in all virtuous and godly living, that we may come to those unspeakable joys, which thou hast prepared for them that unfeignedly love thee; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



Today we celebrate All Saints Day by remembering those who have encouraged us to follow the ways of Jesus and have impacted our lives.

Thanks be to God for all saints, those living and those who have journeyed to be with God.
