

Bigger, Closer, and Better

A few possible next steps

Would you like to experience “the gospel of God” (Mark 1:14), the good news about God according to Jesus? Pause briefly each day to read, reflect, practice, and pray!

READ

In the first chapter of Mark, we hear Jesus preach the good news that “the kingdom of God has come near” (1:14). In the rest of the chapter, we see that Jesus brings the kingdom by vanquishing demonic forces, overcoming illnesses, and restoring people to wholeness.

Monday: Mark 1:1-13

Tuesday: Mark 1:14-20

Wednesday: Mark 1:21-39

Thursday: Mark 1:40-45

Friday: Isaiah 40:1-11

Saturday: Isaiah 52:7-10

Sunday: Catch up on your reading!

REFLECT

After reading the passages listed above, take a few moments to reflect on any or all of the following observations based on the first chapter in the Gospel of Mark.

- Mark portrays Jesus in a way that is stunningly compelling. His unrivaled power and wisdom leave one with a sense of awe, but the portrayal of his unparalleled heart touches us even more deeply. (Jason Meyer, *Mark for You*, p.11)
- As a child blossoms under the authority of a wise and good parent, as a team flourishes under the direction of a skillful, brilliant coach, so when you come under the healing of the royal hands, under the kingship of Jesus, everything in your life will begin to heal. (Timothy Keller, *Jesus the King*, p.18)
- Although Jesus has already exorcised a demon by means of an authoritative command, here he touches the leper, demonstrating complete disregard for its infectious and defiling power. He deliberately crosses the boundary between clean and unclean, thereby accepting the leper’s uncleanness. (R. Alan Culpepper, *Mark*, p.62)

PRACTICE

If you haven’t done so already, make daily Bible a new habit in this new year. It doesn’t have to be complicated or take a lot of time. Just read the passages assigned to each day. Take note of any words, images, or phrases that catch your attention. Is God speaking to you? What might he be saying to you? What might he be asking of you?

PRAY

Turn the Scriptures into prayer by praying each day for God to do what Jesus has done. In other words, ask God to vanquish evil, overcome illness, and/or restore to wholeness. Be specific! Pray for people, places, and situations that weigh heavily on your heart. Make your prayers a passionate expression of your love for others.


